Katie Henderson and Dan Spasic visited the site for an unannounced site inspection. The site was previously inspected by both officers on 31/07/2018. The weather was cloudy and very windy, it had rained prior to our visit. As photographs were taken, a Code B notice was handed to Richard Clews. A selection of these photographs are attached to this form.

Richard Clews, Director and current TCM, showed us around the site. Richard is the TCM for the site and his WAMITAB certificate expires on 11/03/2021. The site is a transfer station which accepts waste from industrial and commercial sources, and then processes and bales (if applicable) the waste, this process complies with the permit. There are also a number of exemptions on the site, registration number WEX133748, which expire on 04/06/2021. The site have a carrier's registration, number CBDU203180 which expires on 08/11/2020.

Due to the current windy weather, the landfills which Clews Recycling use to dispose of some waste are closed. This meant that there was slightly more waste on the site than normal however it is being managed. The waste piles were close to 3 metres during the site inspection, ensure that they do not exceed this as per your permit. The height of the sleepers which act as a bay for the pile can be used to identify the height of the waste.

Within the main section where waste is sorted using a claw, it is placed into areas within the pile (photograph 1). Larger items are waste are placed on the left hand side to allow the right hand side to have smaller items to be fed into the hopper and trommel. There is a 25mm trommel with a fan used to take out weight fraction. A further method of a windsifter is used to separate items further. There is also a picking line where waste is also separated. A baler is used frequently on site and can bale most items such as hard plastics, twine, cardboard and paper.

A diesel tank is on site and this is correctly bunded. Ensure that containers which may have residue to oils/hazardous waste such as blue drums are kept within a bund which can contain 110% of the capacity of the largest tank.

The site has an impermeable surface and there is an interceptor on site which is emptied roughly every six months.

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The site ID board is clearly displayed at the site entrance and has the correct information (photograph 2)

There is CCTV on site and a security company are contracted for the site.

There were no amenity issues at the time of the visit. Although it was windy and there was litter blowing around the site, this could not be seen on the road entering the site. There is a dust suppression system in place to ensure that there are no dust problems.

Returns are up to date and appear to be compliant. A random selection of transfer notes were checked on site and there were no problems with these. The site diary was also checked and thoroughly completed daily by Richard as TCM (photograph 3).


As discussed during the site inspection in July 2018, the site has been affected by the 'China ban' and this is ongoing. UK outlets are being used instead/as well as to ensure that waste is not stockpiled. Some waste is still continuing to go to China has continued to undergo stringent checks to ensure that it is not contaminated. Roughly one in every ten requires an inspection to ensure the contaminant level.
